Things to take into consideration

Weather	The weather in Prince Edward Island is relatively mild, but it can be unpredictable. Summers are warm and sunny, but it can also rain, so be sure to pack accordingly.
Accommodations	There are many accommodation options on the island, including hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts, and vacation rentals. If you plan to visit during the peak season, it's a good idea to plan for accommodation in advance to ensure availability. Our tours include accommodations, so you won't have to worry about this.
Transportation	Outside of Charlottetown, shuttles and transportation might be harder to secure. Although PEI it's a small Island, distances can be longer than expected. We provide shuttle services included in our tours.
Attractions	Make sure to plan your itinerary so you can see everything you want. Many attractions and restaurants are seasonal, so make sure to check their operating hours beforehand.
Food	Prince Edward Island is known for its seafood, including lobster, oysters, and mussels. Many farm-to-table restaurants offer fresh and locally sourced ingredients. While travelling in the countryside, there are not as many options, so plan accordingly. We provide the best options in our itinerary, so you don't have to worry about anything!
Bathroom breaks	If you plan on hiking or exploring some of the island's natural areas, make sure to bring some toilet paper with you. While some trails may have restrooms available, it's always best to be prepared. Trust us, you don't want to be stuck in the great outdoors without any TP! Remember, nature is beautiful, but it can also be a bit unpredictable.
